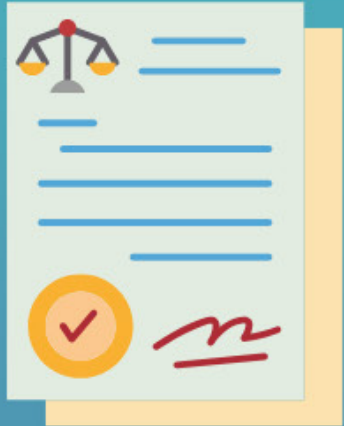


CCAPP CODE OF ETHICS

FOR CREDENTIALLED ALCOHOL AND DRUG PROFESSIONALS



PRINCIPLE ONE

Credentialed AOD professionals shall conduct themselves in an honest, forthright and professional manner.

EXAMPLES OF COMMON VIOLATIONS:

1. Lying on any documentation
2. Yelling at colleagues
3. Misrepresentation of credential – for example, saying you're a CADC when you are a registrant RADT



PRINCIPLE TWO

Credentialed AOD professionals shall maintain professionally appropriate boundaries with clients and family members of clients and shall conduct themselves in a professional, non-exploitive and lawful manner.

EXAMPLES OF COMMON VIOLATIONS:

1. Having lunch with a client
2. Sleeping or socializing with a client within two years of services
3. Selling something to clients
4. Being Facebook friends with client
5. Relapsing and not disclosing it

PRINCIPLE THREE

Credentialed AOD professionals shall comply with all Federal and State Laws and Regulations that pertain to patient/client confidentiality, mandated reporting exceptions, record keeping requirements and patient/client records access.

EXAMPLES OF COMMON VIOLATIONS:

1. Breaching patient/client confidentiality
2. Taking records home with you
